In an increasingly uncertain world, social and environmental needs are mounting, as are the challenges faced by associations working to respond to them. Given this context, we have chosen to refocus our efforts on what matters most - supporting our long-standing partners and helping them increase their impact and build resilience.

Between celebrations and learning new approaches, 2025 is a milestone year for philanthropy at L'Occitane en Provence. From the very beginning, the Maison has supported men and women working on the ground to care for sight, empower women, and preserve biodiversity. And in 2025, the results are clear. Thanks to the L'Occitane en Provence Fund and our subsidiaries around the world, some 23 million people have been able to access quality eye care, more than 62,000 women in Burkina Faso have received support, and over 7,300 hectares of land have been preserved.

Our subsidiaries have continued their commitment to community-based action with strong local initiatives. The Fund has consolidated its international partnerships, while exploring new forms of commitment. For instance, by contributing to customised digital tools developed alongside Share it, we have enabled associations like Helen Keller Europe improve how they monitor the beneficiaries of eye care and assess their impact more accurately.

Finally, because it is important to review the progress made in order to move forward, in 2025 we carried out an impact assessment with consultancy firm Kimso. This impact assessment highlighted nearly 20 years of commitment to the public interest, and identified potential levers for a philanthropy approach that is closely adapted to the needs on the ground. The results are encouraging, with 81% of the associations we supported being able to accelerate or develop new projects, and 74% adopting a more systemic approach. The figures confirm the unique role that companies can play in the associative ecosystem, both as catalysts for change and as strategic partners.

However, the assessment also flagged up areas for improvement. Non-financial support in particular is still not being used to its full potential, even though associations consider this to be a valuable lever. Similarly, the majority of funding remains ad hoc or allocated, which can hamper organisations in their long-term planning or their ability to adapt their actions in an agile way. These are all valuable lessons that will feed into our strategic planning and help us collectively shape the new chapter we are about to embark on.

Between celebrations and learning new approaches, 2025 is a milestone year for philanthropy at Maison L'Occitane en Provence.

# OUR ACHIEVEMENTS

### 2024-2025, A YEAR OF CELEBRATIONS

In 2020 and 2022, the L'Occitane en Provence Fund set impact targets for 2025 in Maison L'Occitane en Provence's three areas of philanthropy action. The objective was to reaffirm and expand the Maison's commitment to serving the public interest, and evaluate the benefits of the projects being supported in line with an approach of continuous improvement. We are therefore particularly proud to make 2025 a year of celebrations, but above all a year of recognition and gratitude.



### **CARING FOR SIGHT**

Having already enabled more than 15 million beneficiaries worldwide to access quality eye care, in 2022 L'Occitane en Provence increased its ambition: enable **20 million people** to access essential eye care, in order to preserve sight and quality of life around the world. Mission accomplished! So far, 22,110,272 beneficiaries have received eye care support from our partners.

## FOCUS ON...



### 1 Improving access to eye care with the HEART TO HEART FOUNDATION

Since 2017, our subsidiary in Korea has been working alongside the Heart to Heart Foundation. The projects set up by the association as part of this long-term partnership are designed to provide high-quality primary eye care to communities in need. Over the course of this eight-year partnership, more than **2,260,000 people** have received eye care in **five different countries** (Tanzania, Malawi, Cambodia, South Korea, and Bangladesh).



### 2 | Strengthening eye health systems with SIGHTSAVERS

Since 2013, the L'Occitane en Provence Fund has been working with Sightsavers to eliminate Onchocerciasis (also known as "River Blindness") in the Cascades region of Burkina Faso. As part of the campaign, nearly 830,000 treatments for this endemic disease have been delivered under a mass drug administration programme.

The Fund also supports Sightsavers in its efforts to strengthen the eye health system in this region, so that everyone can access quality eye care.

### RESPECTING BIODIVERSITY

In 2022, L'Occitane en Provence committed to restoring **1,500 hectares of land** thanks to its philanthropy activities. As a result of our partners' reforestation and agroforestry initiatives, this target was far exceeded, with **7,300 hectares** preserved.

## FOCUS ON...



### 1 Restoring the Atlantic Forest with WEFOREST

Since 2023, the L'Occitane en Provence Fund has been working with WeForest as part of a three-year partnership to restore **87 hectares of Atlantic Forest** along the Tietê River in Brazil. In response to deforestation and erosion threatening local ecosystems, the project combines agroforestry techniques, the restoration of native vegetation, and the involvement of local communities. The results are improved water retention, less sedimentation, and better ecological corridors.

### 2 I Bushfire recovery with the FOUNDATION FOR NATIONAL PARKS & WILDLIFE

Following the devastating bushfires in Australia in 2020. the L'Occitane en Provence Fund initiated a partnership with the Foundation for National Parks & Wildlife to support the sustainable restoration of affected forest areas. Taken over in 2023-2024 by L'Occitane en Provence's Australian subsidiary, the next phase of the project aims to restore biodiversity hotspots through reforestation, the restoration of fragmented habitats, and the control of invasive species. Since this partnership began, 1,000 hectares of forest have been preserved and 500,000 trees have been planted.



### **EMPOWERING WOMEN**

In 2020, after 15 years of delivering support to more than 30,000 women in Burkina Faso, the L'Occitane en Provence Fund sought to increase its impact by helping **twice as many beneficiaries** achieve economic independence. Our partner associations have set up initiatives to provide girls with access to education and offer women vocational and entrepreneurship training. We are proud of these partnerships, which have helped us achieve our target and have improved the living conditions of **62,218 girls and women in Burkina Faso.**

### 11 Encouraging female entrepreneurship with EMPOW'HER

Since 2019, the L'Occitane en Provence Fund has been working with Empow'Her to support female entrepreneurship in Burkina Faso. Initially focused on shea butter producers with the Étincelles project, in 2021 the partnership expanded with the Bloom project, dedicated to the professional integration and economic empowerment of the most vulnerable women. Driven by an approach based on trust and continuous adaptation, the programme is incorporating new initiatives (art workshops, psychological support, mobile nurseries) to provide a favourable environment for learning and the economic empowerment of **450 women**.

### 2 I Supporting girls' education with UNICEF FRANCE

Since 2021, the L'Occitane en Provence Fund has been supporting UNICEF France in its campaign to educate young girls in the Centre-Ouest region of Burkina Faso. This successful collaboration has ensured access and retention in secondary education for **800 girls** in vulnerable situations. It is also improving their learning environment with awareness-raising activities on gender-based violence and by providing shelters.

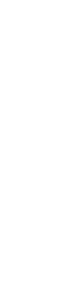

# 2024-2025 A YEAR OF RENEWED CONFIDENCI During what is a year of transition in terms of Maison L'Occitane en Provence's philanthropy strategy, and in a context that is particularly challenging for associations, we have chosen to focus our efforts on supporting our existing partners. As well as providing additional funding to address emergencies and growing needs, we have embarked on targeted action to strengthen their capacities. The aim is to help them become more structured, build up their autonomy, and improve their resilience so they are able to maintain their positive impact in the field.

## L'OCCITANE EN PROVENCE FUND'S ACTION: REINFORCED PARTNERSHIPS FOR SUSTAINED IMPACT



### RESPONDING TO NATURAL DISASTERS

In 2024-2025, the L'Occitane en Provence Fund strengthened its commitment to populations affected by natural disasters, by approving an **annual budget** dedicated to areas considered a priority by the Maison. This mechanism allows for a rapid and targeted response, in collaboration with trusted partner associations.

Under this framework, the Fund was able to respond to three major emergencies:

**In Brazil**, with the **BrazilFoundation**, following the May 2024 floods in the Rio Grande do Sul region;

**In Spain**, alongside the **Altius Foundation**, after the October 2024 floods in Valencia:

**In Mayotte** (France), in support of **Médecins Sans Frontières** and **Acted**, after Cyclone Chido struck in December 2024.

## 1 Facilitating access to eye care with SIGHTSAVERS and LIGHT FOR THE WORLD

This partnership is helping to improve the eye care system in the Cascades region of Burkina Faso and enable its integration into the country's national health system. In order to generate the data needed for improved planning and a more efficient and sustainable healthcare system, the project is helping regional and local partners to develop a structured process for collecting and communicating information.



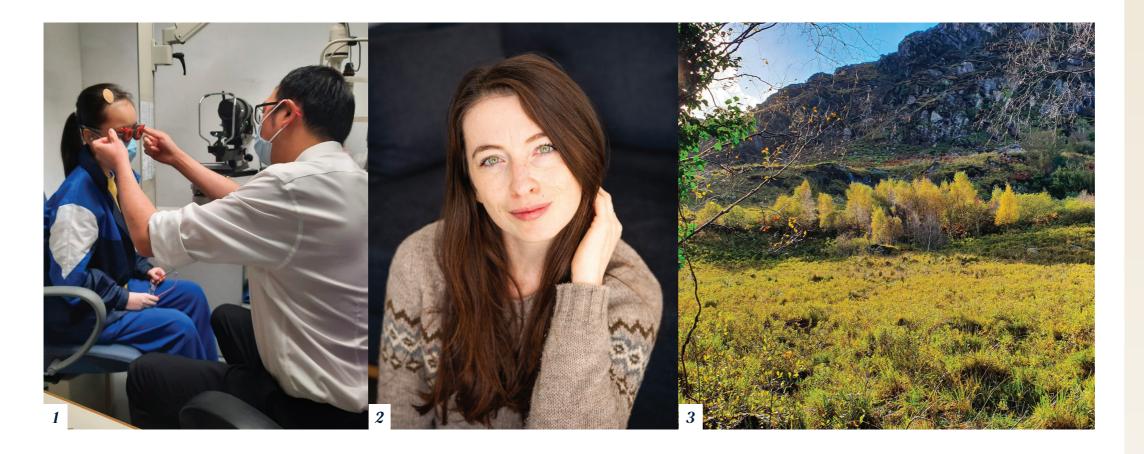


## 2 I Working together for a sustainable economy with BUSINESS FOR NATURE

In 2024-2025, the L'Occitane en Provence Fund strengthened its commitment to biodiversity alongside Business for Nature. This global coalition, active in Africa, Asia, and Latin America, works to promote the adoption of ambitious environmental policies. Thanks to a broad network of companies and organisations, this alliance focuses on advocacy, international mobilisation, and strategic communication to accelerate concrete actions to preserve nature.

## 3 I Supporting associations' technological development with SHARE IT

This partnership aims to improve the effectiveness of eye health awareness campaigns run by the Helen Keller Europe association. Share it is developing a CRM tool and a new digital application to optimise screening data entry methods, monitor eye care beneficiaries, and analyse results. Centralising data reduces the time between screening and treatment, while making it easier for Helen Keller Europe to analyse and exploit the data collected.



### L'OCCITANE EN PROVENCE SUBSIDIARIES' ACTION: CLOSELY ADAPTED TO THE NEEDS ON THE GROUND

### 1 Intervention in schools with the HONG KONG SOCIETY FOR THE BLIND

For several years, L'Occitane en Provence's Hong Kong subsidiary has been supporting the Hong Kong Society for the Blind and its early detection programme in nursery schools. In 2024-2025, **958 children** benefitted from eye care.

"The project has made it possible to identify visual impairments in children and prevent them from getting worse thanks to early intervention. The screening programme has not only improved the academic performance of the children concerned, but has also raised parents' awareness of their children's visual health."

### 2 I Facilitating business creation with ADIE

In the south of France, the focus is on women's economic empowerment, with support for Adie and its 'Passage des entrepreneuses'. This entrepreneurial hub has enabled **33 women** to launch, develop, and sustain their businesses.

## 3 | Supporting community reforestation with HOMETREE

In Ireland, L'Occitane en Provence's subsidiary has chosen to take environmental action and help restore the Irish highlands in partnership with Hometree. Historically covered by 80% of native forest, Ireland now has less than 1% remaining. The project aims to promote natural regeneration by removing grazing pressure, fencing off remaining pockets of forest to allow them to expand naturally, and planting trees where there is a strong ecological justification for doing so. The active involvement of local communities lies at the heart of the initiative.

### EMPLOYEE COMMITMENT, A DRIVER FOR CHANGE

Thanks to the L'Occitane en Provence employee commitment plan, every employee can volunteer with an association for **one to four days per year**, contributing their time, energy, and expertise.

In Brazil, our subsidiary organises an annual commitment week. In 2024-2025, with activities ranging from planting seedlings to organising the distribution of hygiene kits, as well as renovating a dog park in a city square, a total 193 employees volunteered with six different associations.

In Japan, employees can volunteer up to three days with an association. This year, with recent studies estimating that 40 tons of plastic waste are dumped into the ocean every minute, 34 employees chose to participate in public beach clean-ups in partnership with the Green Bird association.



In South Korea, employee commitment reached a peak this year with 100% of the subsidiary's 221 employees participating in a volunteer initiative, notably producing books in braille for the visually impaired. This is a great example of a collective dynamic in favour of active solidarity, focusing on the inclusion of some of the most vulnerable in society.

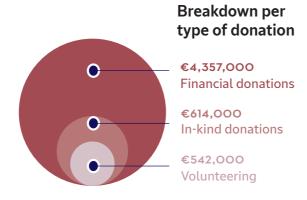

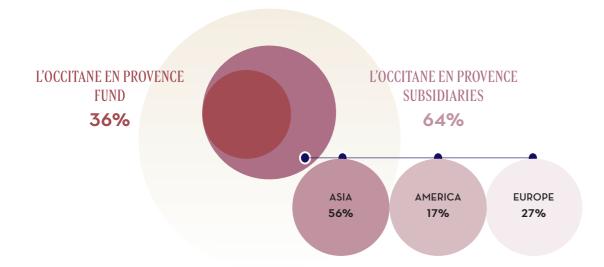

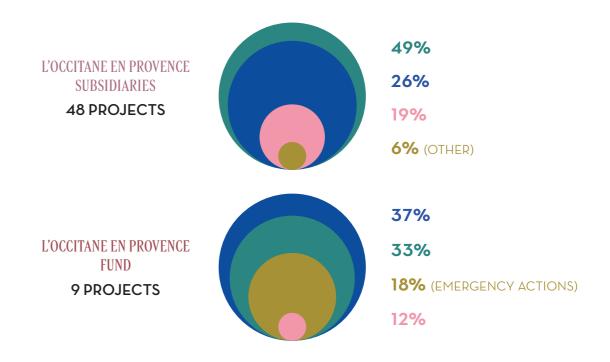
